

CHAPTER-2

TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION

Our endeavour in Sardar Patel University has been to ensure a certain awakening and enlightenment in the process of teaching-learning both at the levels of teaching and learning. Our aim is to trigger off a process leading to life-long learning. This is fortified by the philosophy contained in the Sanskrit dictum, “Sheel Vritta Falam Shrutam” which forms an important part of our logo. Translated into English, this would read, as “Character and conduct are the fruits of learning.” To add to this, as it were, we lay emphasis on excellence. ‘Excellence Matters’ is not a mere slogan for us but an affirmation of our desire to chart and attain excellence in all we do as a university. We hold Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel’s warning to educationists in a speech made in Gujarati. Its English translation reads: “Education without character is of no value. We must be intent on producing citizens of Independent India and not helpless people loitering for jobs.”

Teaching for us is a tool to trigger change in a person’s behaviour potential to a situation in hand, manifesting itself in conduct reflecting an attitude, knowledge, better understanding, appreciation etc. We were mandated at the time of establishment of this university ‘to accelerate the process of regeneration of villages by the application of modern arts, sciences and technology to rural requirements’. The education required was of the kind that would help shape character and conduct by empowering learners from rural areas to be self-reliant and capable of self-employment rather than employment-seeking citizens. We are fortunate to have nearly replicated the guru-shishya tradition of the ancient times, minus the ashram-type situation, thanks to our semi-urban composition.

We have been able to put in a transparent and accountable system of evaluation involving blind assessment using non-transparent flapping of their seat numbers by the examinees at the end of an examination; secure centralised process of evaluation and compilation of results; speedy and confidential reassessment by external examiners outside this university; stricter penalties for unethical methods used by the students or evaluators after a free and fair hearing by the Unfair Means Committee appointed by the University Syndicate; on-the-spot verification of marked answerscripts by any student harbouring doubts about the outcome of evaluation; creation of grievance redressal committee etc voluntarily and as mandated by the UGC or the Education Department of the Government of Gujarat. All this has led to stress-free examinations and timely declaration of results

The Academic calendar of colleges and University Departments in various faculties is prepared and announced well in advance. Alternative teaching arrangements are always made of the teachers, if a teacher is absent. Teachers mark the presence of the students in each lecture everyday. Normally every teacher is available in the department at least for six hours a day, irrespective of his/her lecture schedule on that given day. In fact, some of the science departments and management department function from 9:00 am to late in the evening and even on holidays. This makes for the availability of teachers for students’ counselling for the whole day.

2.2 Admission

Complete transparency in admissions and evaluation, efficient use of time, a student-friendly approach, strict adherence to merit, special provisions for students from weaker sections like SC, ST, SEBC, Physically/Visually handicapped etc as well as for meritorious students, and special provisions for students from other universities in Gujarat as well as the other states in the Union of India are the hallmarks of our policy on admissions.

We try to work with precision of clock and are, therefore, regular in all aspects of the teaching-learning process that is central to a University. The admission process is set in motion once a thoroughly updated prospectus containing an application form in it is ready. The prospectus is available online. This is designed to introduce the University, highlighting the details of the admission process to guide them in choosing the right academic programme for them. Each of the Departments in the University brings out a leaflet-type brochure containing details of the programmes and courses offered, facilities available in it, names of the entire faculty consisting of specialist teachers, with their specializations clearly indicated, the work done by the Department so far, and its future plans. Any applicant who wishes to know more has the option of contacting the Department concerned free guidance and counseling before he/she makes an application for admission to it.

The University issues an official notification in mid-May every year and then gets this published in newspapers with large circulation. We invite and process the applications during the last two weeks of the preceding academic year to cut down upon the time taken to complete the process of admissions. Having processed the applications, we prepare the merit list of all applicants desirous of seeking admission to a particular programme and display it on the University website (www.spuvvn.edu) for public access. We have developed a system of centralized admissions. The merit list of applicants for each programme is also displayed prominently on the Notice Board in the Department concerned and online. The counselling date/admission date/test date/interview date and time for different Departments are announced in the prospectus itself. In addition, the admission process is executed as per the schedule in a transparent way.

Each of the Departments in the University has an admission committee, usually with the Head as the convener, entrusted with the task of finalizing admissions. The committee has the brief of ensuring that admissions are granted strictly on the basis of merit. However, when there is provision of an entrance test for admission on a particular programme, a new merit list, which has a judicious mix of the initial merit and merit based on the results of the entrance test (intimated beforehand in the Prospectus), is used for granting admissions. This way, we admit applicants in the order of merit against open seats, reserved seats for SC (7%), ST (15%), SEBC (27%), Physically/Visually handicapped (3%) etc, and seats for students from other universities in Gujarat (10%) and the other states in the Union of India (20% seats set aside for them in Departments in the University recognized by the UGC under its Special Assistance Programme (SAP) because this is mandatory under the UGC provisions). The process is usually completed in a day or two at the most.

We use the e-mail, the Internet, and the telephone as tools to communicate effectively and efficiently within a short span of time. The academic calendars are ready by the time the admissions are over, and these are then displayed on the notice board in the Department concerned, which is how we are able to begin teaching immediately thereafter.

2.3 International Students

An International Students Centre (ISC) was established in Sardar Patel University in June-July 2004. The objectives behind its establishment are: (a) to assist the International Student Community by providing information related to various courses on offer in any given year, the procedure of admission to these courses, criteria governing eligibility, the fee to be paid etc, and (b) to facilitate the applicants in getting admission, help them settle down quickly and happily, take active interest in their studies, and take care of their welfare, including their security clearance from the local police, and so on.

Our ISC has been singularly responsible for coordinating all the activities related to the admission of international scholars through a Single Window System ever since its inception. It coordinates with Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), Ministries of Human Resource Development (MHRD), External Affairs (MEA), and Home Affairs (MHA), as well as with different Embassies and Consulates for various purposes including assisting them in obtaining student or research Visa, Scholarships etc.

International Students Centre has accommodated most of these International Students with Scholarship from the ICCR, New Delhi, in the University Staff Colony, Vallabh Vidyanagar to ensure their safety and give them peaceful atmosphere.

Dr J H Khan, Professor of English, and Honorary Director, Centre for Training and Research in Language and Communication, Coordinator, IQAC, I/C Director, Media Studies has been taking care of ISC as Honorary Director, since 23 August 2006.

2.6 Teaching-Learning Avenues

Besides formal lectures and experiments in the laboratories, teachers use an array of other methods of teaching-learning such as lecture-cum-workshop, guest lectures by experts, projects, case studies, and summer training, supported by computer and Internet facilities, and special efforts made to prepare the learners to take NET-JRF, participation in research seminars in the department concerned. The following are the details:

(1) Seminars/Guest Lectures/Conferences

There is a provision for obligatory Students Seminars in each subject in Basic Sciences in each semester. Thus in every semester, every student has to present one seminar in each paper. Besides these there are weekly departmental researches seminars conducted during the year in the Departments like Department of Mathematics, Department of Physics, Some laboratories in the Department of Biosciences which are accessible to PhD, MPhil, MSc students. The research conferences and other guest lectures are organized during the year.

(2) Projects and Summer Trainings

- There is provision for mandatory research projects in the last semester in the Departments of Biosciences, Home Science, Statistics, and Master in Quality and Productivity and in Computer Science. In the Department of Business Management, students have to prepare a term paper.
- There is a provision for optional research projects in Department of Physics and Department of Mathematics.
- In the Department of Social Work there is a provision for mandatory field trip.

(4) Computer Training / Internet Connectivity

The University Computer Centre, which manages all the Internet connections in the University, provides training to students in the use of the Internet as a knowledge resource. It does this through an optional paper or as a part of the curriculum it has on offer. All the University Departments have Internet connectivity, which is how it could be made easily accessible to the MPhil and PhD students

in the Department concerned. The University Library provides access to online journals through INFLIBNET. It also hosts University Cyber Café.

(5) Special Efforts for NET-JRF/GATE

Special efforts are being made in several University Departments for training meritorious students and those from SC, ST, and Minority categories for Competitive Exams at the national level like NET-JRF/GATE. One day workshops for training for NET-JRF/GATE were organized in every science department as well as the Department of Business Studies. Also a week long workshop was organized by the Department of Mathematics for the students in Gujarat State. This was sixth Annual Workshop in a row.

(6) Departmental Libraries

The University has promoted the concept of Departmental Libraries and offers full support in the establishment and enrichment of these in each of the Postgraduate Departments, the details of which have been made available elsewhere in this Report. The Departmental Libraries supplement the Bhaikaka Library, which is the Central University Library. The Department of Mathematics has the Western Region Library supported by the National Board for Higher Mathematics, Department of Atomic Energy, Government of India. This is one of the 11 such Regional Libraries in Mathematics across India.

2.7 Evaluation

The Examination Section, in consultation with the University Departments and Colleges draws up an annual plan for holding semester/annual examinations at the beginning of any academic year, and follows this plan meticulously. The results are announced well in time.

Each of the Papers has a total weighting of 100 marks with 70% set aside for University through final qualifying examinations and 30% for continuous internal assessment consisting of tests, seminars and quizzes. Thus, the examinations in the University comprise of two components: external and internal evaluation. With the introduction of CBCS the University also revised the question paper style. This now comprises of an objective component and a well-balance unitwise questions to facilitate the students preping for examination a question bank for each paper is prepared and circulated among the students. The questions set usually require a reasonable amount of knowledge and skills pertaining to a course in a given unit from a student. We have a transparent system of allowing the students to see

their marked scripts after every internal test and the examiner concerned takes time to discuss with his/her students the nitty-gritty of evaluation. The provision of blind assessment (the scripts are flapped!), and blind reassessment by teachers outside the university for students on the PG courses, and the teachers of the Postgraduate Department concerned in the University for the undergraduate examinations are made. What is more, there is moderation of assessment at undergraduate level examinations.

2.9 Examination Reforms Unit

The Examination Reforms Unit was established in 1976 in Sardar Patel University and received grants from the UGC until March 1995. It was only then that the State Government began to shoulder the financial burden.

Examination Reforms Unit of the University has a very long history of about 32 years, during which its dynamic conveners along with efficient teams have plunged headlong into implementation of various programmes of examination reforms formulated by the UGC.

In a circular dated 19.1.83 sent to all the Universities in India, the UGC had insisted that they implement programmes like (1) Continuous evaluation, (2) Development of Question bank, and (3) Grading and Semester systems to ensure improvement in the objectivity, reliability, and validity of evaluation practices while at the same time to ensure a better correlation between teaching, learning and evaluation. It had also suggested that they pay urgent attention to the task of redesigning their syllabi, question papers, and actual conduct of examinations. It informed them that the purpose of these suggestions was to bring about qualitative improvement in the examination system prevalent in country at that time.

Examination Reforms Undertaken

We initiated the following measures with effect from the University Examinations to ensure that the system does not lose its credibility and examinations are conducted without any let or hindrance in just and fair manner:

- 1 Each of the answer-books used have a Serial No. In the space on the top which also has the Examination No. of the Candidate concerned and the Junior Supervisor's signature. All this is flapped by the examinee himself/ herself, thereby lending a greater credibility to the system.
- 2 The answer books are distributed faculty-wise with separate numbers allotted to every faculty to ensure its identity and to foreclose the possibility of the misuse of the answer books. Arrangements have been put in place to maintain the account of the answer books block-wise at the Examination Centres.
- 3 Seating arrangements for Examinations in various disciplines in different institutions are made in accordance with an alphabetically arranged list of the candidates name-wise, keeping in mind the first letter in his/her name. We also take into account the seating capacity available in a given institution for accommodating examinees.
- 4 We have introduced a Hall-Ticket with a given candidate's photograph printed on it for the Junior Supervisor in the Examination Hall could use it to ascertain the examinee's identity. It also lists the subjects in whom he or she would appear alongside day, date, and time of examination etc.
- 5 The presence of examinees is marked on a preprinted supervisor's reports.
- 6 Arrangements have been made for the examiners to receive payment on completion of their evaluation of the answer books during central assessment, so that he or she does not have to bother about the lengthy administrative procedures and the university is able to expedite the declaration of the Results.
- 7 We publish the Results on the University Website too.
- 8 Arrangements have been made to make available to the students their markscripts within 10 days of the declaration of the Results.
- 9 We have begun to use special security features on the markscripts, including those of them that lie unused so as to guard against their possible misuse for fabricating fake/bogus markscripts.

- 10 Irregularities and malpractices during examinations have been brought under check thanks to the appointment of squads at sensitive Examination Centres.
- 11 We have constituted flying squads with members of the Syndicate and the teachers in the PG Departments to visit the examination Centres to obviate any irregularity and/or malpractice, thus restoring the trust and confidence of those who tend to be put off due to this very reason.
- 12 We have been making public through newspapers the penalties imposed on the erring examinees. The reverse side of the Hall-Ticket carries the nature of malpractice and the penalties imposed.
- 13 We have made it obligatory for a candidate to affix his/her photograph on the application form.
- 14 We have been declaring the proposed dates and announcing the timetable for various exams and the results well in advance.
- 15 Special care is being taken to expedite the Re-assessment.
- 16 Special envelopes have been introduced for examination-related work in the university.
- 17 We have modified the front page of the answer book to introduce columns for entering the marks of reassessment and this was made effective from the University Examination in March/April-2007.
- 18 In the process of Re-assessment, answer-sheet observation by students is introduced.
