By revisiting life skills through this forward-looking lens, we enrich personal competencies, equipping individuals with the adaptive agency needed to move from merely managing day-to-day adversity to stewardship-driven behaviour.

PUBLICATION GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS FOR ORAL/ONLINE PRESENTATION:

- ☞ Abstracts submitted for consideration should use the following criteria:
- ☞ An abstract should not exceed 300 words (Any abstract that exceeds the required word count will not enter the review process).
- ☞ The relevant conference thematic track should be identified
- ☞ The abstract should be in English (Font: Times New Roman, size 12), or Gujarati (Shruti font, size 12.5) or in Hindi (Shruti font, size 13)

- ☛ Line spacing should be 1.5, overall margins should be 1 inch
- ☛ The title should be as brief as possible but long enough to indicate the nature of the study
- ☛ Abstracts should state briefly the background, purpose/objectives, methodology, results and conclusions/discussions of the study and keywords
- ☛ The abstract should indicate the first author of the paper by adding one * as the superscript after the name (Eg, Axxxx*)
- ☛ The designation and affiliation of the authors should be mentioned on a separate page. The contact details of the Corresponding Author, including phone number and email address, should be mentioned.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF FULL PAPERS FOR ORAL/ONLINE PRESENTATION

- ☛ The following criteria are to be considered while submitting full papers:
- ☛ Author's name should be on the title page only, to facilitate a blind referring process
- ☛ The following order is to be noted when typing the manuscript:
- ☛ Title, Authors, Affiliation, Abstract, Keywords, Main Text, Acknowledgements, Appendix and References
- ☛ The manuscript must
- ☛ Be typed, 1.5 spaced (single spaced for indented material, notes and references)
- ☛ Have the suggested font size - all headings, including the title, should be in 14, Full papers in English -Font Times New Roman and text should be in 12-point size , Full Papers in Gujarati-Font Shruti, 12.5-point size, Full papers in Hindi – Font Shruti, 13-point size
- ☛ Have margins of 1 inch on all sides
- ☛ Follow APA format for reference
- ☛ Full papers should include a separate page containing:
 - Title of paper
 - Suggested topic and sub-theme
 - Name(s) of authors
 - Organisation/Institution affiliation
 - Corresponding Author, Cell phone, Fax, E-mail address

👉 Note: Full papers will only be accepted for review if:

- The manuscript has not been copyrighted, published, presented or accepted for presentation at any other academic gathering and is not currently under review for presentation/ publication. A declaration to this effect must accompany the final paper in the format that will be shared.
- Completed papers are received by the appropriate deadline and conform to the format and length requirements.
