Supervised Field Work Practicum to be undertaken in Field Work Settings Supervised Field Work Practicum to be undertaken in NGO sector OR Development sector OR Open communities (rural, urban, tribal) OR Government sector OR Community health sector OR Online Mode or as below (this list is indicative and not all inclusive & exhaustive): Health Setting- Hospitals, Medical colleges, Community health extension projects, Primary health centres, Clinics, and HIV Guidance Centres etc. Educational Setting - Formal schools, non-formal/adult education centres, income generating skill development centres, vocational training facilities, etc. Community Services - Skill development programme centres, vocational training centres, environment improvement centres, family service centres, Community development projects in urban and rural settings, etc. Institutional and Non-institutional Services - for Special Groups like the Divyang Jan, Differently abled, Mentally Challenged, Destitute, Migrants, Women, Street Children, Elderly, and Other Vulnerable Groups; Adoption Agencies, Child Rights Protection Facilities, Rehabilitation centres, Labour Welfare Centres/workers education centres etc. Criminal Justice System- Prisons/Jails, District Child Protection Units, Juvenile Police Units, Family Counseling Centres, ADR centres, Courts, Police stations, and agencies under the Juvenile Justice Act.
