Syllabus with Effect from: July - 2013

The Three Year LL.B. Degree Programme in law has been updated in conformity with the Bar Council of India Rules -2008. The revised curriculum of Three Year LL.B. (CBCS) Degree Programme shall come into force progressively from June, 2013.

(However, the students admitted in the old First LL.B. (General), Second LL.B. (General) and LL.B. (Special) course **up to** the academic year 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15 respectively shall have an option to appear and pass the respective examinations up to two years i.e. four examinations to be held after the completion of academic year 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15 respectively. Thereby, the terms kept earlier under old First LL.B. (General), old Second LL.B. (General) and old LL.B. (Special) courses shall stand lapsed or nullified after the end of the academic year 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 respectively.)

The academic regulations and updated syllabus of Three Year LL.B. (CBCS) Degree Programme and the courses are given below:

R.L.1. Candidate for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws must have graduated in any discipline of knowledge from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent National Institution recognized as a Deemed to be University or Foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence with minimum 45% of the total marks in case of General Category candidates and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST candidates in the qualifying examination.

However, the maximum age for seeking admission is limited to 30 years in case of General category of applicants and 35 years in case of applicants from SC, ST and OBC.

(Note: -Admissions to the reserved category shall be granted as per the prevailing rules of the Government of Gujarat from time to time.)

R.L.2. The duration of the Three Year LL.B. Degree Programme shall be three years i.e. Six Semesters (I to VI) and the End Semester Examinations will be conducted under the CBCS (Choice Based Credit System). For this purpose, each academic year will be divided into Two Semesters i.e. Odd and Even semesters and the admission procedure will usually take place only during odd semesters i.e. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester.

However, candidate shall not be admitted in any of the Semesters if he/she has passed or granted his/her previous semester/s under old syllabus i.e. not in CBCS pattern. In this case, he/she shall take fresh admission in the First Semester.

R.L.3. The maximum intake capacity in each of the section of a class shall not be more than 60 students and the college may be allowed a minimum of two sections in each class but not more than five sections in one class (such as First Year or Second Year or Third Year) as the case may be unless there is any exceptional reason for granting more sections in a Class after the said reason is specified by the Inspection committee of the Bar Council of India.

R.L.4. The medium of Instruction shall be English. However the candidates may write the examination in English, Gujarati or Hindi language.

R.L.5. No candidate will be admitted to any End Semester Examination in a subject unless it is certified by the Principal of his/her college:



- (i) That he/she has attended minimum 70% of the classes held in the subject concerned and the courses of study to the satisfaction of the Principal at a college recognized for teaching courses of study in law by this University and
- (ii) That he/she has obtained not less than 30% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects in the compulsory Internal Test conducted by the college.

R.L.6. Candidates desirous of appearing at any End Semester Examination must forward their application in the prescribed form to the Registrar of the University through the Principal of the college on or before the date prescribed for the said purpose under the relevant ordinances.

R.L.7. If the candidate who is successfully granted the term and who does not appear/clear the Odd Semester i.e. 1st, 3rd or 5th Semester will be entitled to get admission in the Even Semester i.e. 2nd, 4th or 6th semester respectively. Such candidates shall be entitled to appear in the Odd and Even End Semester Examination simultaneously subject to the compliance of other requirements. If the candidate does not appear/clear the Even Semester i.e. 2nd, 4th or 6th Semester in the first attempt, he/she will be allowed to re-write the End Semester Examination of those semesters in the regular schedule of the University Examinations in the next academic semester.

R.L.8. No candidate will be allowed to reappear at Examination which he has already passed.

R.L.9. If the candidate is granted term in any of the semesters in LL.B. (CBCS) Programme, he/she can continue his/her term maximum for Five Years or the change of Syllabus, whichever is earlier. However, the Vice Chancellor may extend the period by one or more year on behalf of the Executive Council. Thereafter, the candidate has to grant his/her term afresh.

R.L.10. A candidate failing in any of the papers at a semester examination and passes out such papers by the six semesters, such attempt will be considered as First Attempt.

R.L.11. For purpose of deciding final results at any of the Semester Examinations in Law, the ratio between the Internal and External assessment shall be 30:70 and for Practical Papers 1, 2, 3 & 4 in the sixth semester, the ratio between the Internal and External assessment shall be 50:50 respectively. For the purpose of Internal assessment, the college concerned will conduct at least one test in each Semester/Term. The college may also arrange Quizzes, Term Papers, Assignments, Project work, Field work, Seminar/Presentation, etc.

R.L.12. (i) The students will be required to earn stipulated credits per course per semester for obtaining the LL.B. Degree as shown below:

(ii) The credit per course is determined as One Credit equivalent to One Hour of study for the duration of 15 weeks per semester with not less than 24 lecture-hours per week.

(iii) The workload of a faculty shall be determined considering the total number of lecture-hours of study.

R.L.13. The students shall study the following courses of Three Year LL.B. (CBCS) Programme as per the following structure: **(As per Annexure I)**



R.L.14. Standard of Passing:

- a) To Pass the Semester Examination, a candidate must obtain at least 40% marks in each paper at the University Examination and also in the total of University Examination and Internal Assessment added together.
- b) Award of Classes:
The Candidate shall be awarded grades in each semester as per the 7 point scale grading system as under:

- I. The candidate shall have to secure “E” grade in each Semester for passing
- II. The passing criteria shall be implied in accordance with the rules/ordinance implemented by the Sardar Patel University from time to time for CBCS programmes.

Notes:

- (1) For Awarding University Gold Medal/s, performance of the Candidates in External University Examination shall only be considered.
- (2) Candidate passing any semester Examination in compartments will not be eligible for award of Gold Medal.

R.L.15. The following are the detailed syllabus for the various courses to be offered to the students by the affiliated colleges/Institutes under the Three Year LL.B. (CBCS) Degree Programme:
