Programme Outcome (PO) - For MA History Programme	History is one of the oldest subjects taught, and for any educated, cultured human it is important to know history. A vast portion of history is part of what is called 'general knowledge'. A history student needs to know much more than what history as general knowledge is, which means among other things not only knowledge of dates, dynasties, wars, treaties and other such 'important' events but also how these all came about and what were the consequences, and more importantly how historians reconstruct them and how their own biases colour historical narratives. This course familiarises students with the general world history, gives an indepth understanding of Indian history, and offers a specialisation in modern Indian history with special emphasis on the history of modern Gujarat.
