POST BASIC B.Sc. NURSING (2 YEAR COURSE)

The University will abide by the rules and regulations in regards to Admission, Vacations, Examination and Clinical Experience as laid down by the syllabi of Indian Nursing council.

REGULATION FOR COURSE IN POST BASIC B.SC. NURSING

1.	Admission requirement :- A candidate seeking for admission to the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing course which is of Two years duration ,must have passed the Diploma General Nursing and Midwifery(DGNM) Examination and registered by State Nursing Council and must have attained the age not more than 40 years. Students will be admitted through the Particular Institution personal interview of candidate by following admission criteria laid down by Indian Nursing Council.
	A student who has passed DGNM examination from other State Council and any other University and is seeking admission to the Post Basic B.Sc Nursing will be considered eligible for admission only if she produce Provisional Registration certificate from the particular State Nursing Council and Migration certificate and Eligibility certificate from the Sardar Patel University.
2.	Vacation :Students should have 4 weeks vacation and 1 week sick leave per annum which should be counted towards the period of training. Sick leave should not be accumulated from year to year except in exceptional circumstances.
	Any other extra leave taken by the students should be made up during the academic year only. Students are granted sick leave as per rule and are allowed to appear for examination provided student should produce a certificate from the treating doctor and submitted to head of Institution.
3.	No candidate will be admitted to any examination in the Post Basic B.Sc Nursing unless certified by the Principal of college of Nursing:
3.1	That students has attended the course of the study not less than 80% of the formal instruction given on each subjects at Nursing college recognized for teaching course of study in Post Basic B.Sc Nursing by the University.
3.2	That student has undergone 100% practical training prescribed in the syllabus separately during the year for the examination.
3.3	That before appearing for the final examination of First year and Second year. student has passed institutional tests in all the subjects of the concerned year.



	INTERNAL EXAMINATION:
3.4	A students will have to procure minimum 13 out of 25 marks to pass internal assessment in all the subjects of the concerned year to be eligible to appear for the final University examination. Internal assessment will be done by holding: In Paper :1-Nursing Foundation, and Paper :2 -Nutrition and Dietetics students will have to procure minimum 8 mark out of 15 marks to pass internal assessment.
3.5	In Paper :1-Nursing Foundation, and Paper :2 -Nutrition and Dietetics, two unit test will be of 15 marks, For rest of the theory papers, two unit test of 25 marks of each.
3.6 3.7	In Paper :1-Nursing Foundation, and Paper :2 -Nutrition and Dietetics, the internal examination of 35 marks and for rest of the theory papers, the internal examination of 75 marks of each. For second year in subject of Introduction to Nursing Research & Statistics only 50 marks of internal examination, there is no University examination and marks to be sent to University for Inclusion in the Mark sheet.
3.8	Three Internal examination of 50 marks of each practical and in second year for Research Project only Institution exam ,no University examination and marks to be sent to University for inclusion in the mark sheet.
3.9	Various assignments in each subject of 25 marks as prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council will have to be submitted in the stipulated time for assessment.
3.10	A students failing in internal assessment will not be eligible to appear for university examination in that particular papers /practical. She/he has to repeat the First term of that particular year and successfully complete and pass the internal to be eligible to appear for that particular paper/ practical for the next University Supplementary Examination EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:
4.	A Candidate shall be eligible for admission to examination if:
4.1	She/he has completed not less than ten month of the course and that her/his total performance has been satisfactory during that period.
4.2	She/he has attended 80% of the formal instruction in given on each subject and 100% Clinical experience as separately during the year but the degree shall not be awarded until the student fulfilled the clinical requirement as prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council.
4.3	Her /his record of practical experience must be up to date.
4.4	The Principal of college of Nursing will have to send internal marks for each theory papers as well as practical.
4.5	A candidate must have to pass in internal examinations.
4.6	Candidates desirous of appearing at any examination for Post Basic B.Sc Nursing must forward their applications in the prescribed form to the Registrar through the



	Principal of college of Nursing on or before the date prescribes for the purpose along with prescribed examination fees under the relevant ordinances.
4.7	The university hold examination for all the subjects i.e. First year and Second year i.e. in month of July and supplementary examination after six months for students who having ATKT. Maximum number of attempts permitted for each paper is 3 including first
	attempt.
	Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical papers
	separately and aggregate of external exam and internal exam.
4.8	For the purpose of deciding final result the ratio between the internal assessment and the external assessment for the University Examination will be 25:75. For the purpose of internal marks, internal assessment of every students will be assessed throughout her training period i.e. First year and Second year of studies by holding regular tests and internal exams in various subjects.
4.9	Assessment will also be done through assignment of case study, case presentation, health teaching, drug study and care plan etc. when she is working in the clinical field.
4.10	No candidate will be allowed to reappear for any paper of course passed by her.
4.11	No Candidate will be declared successful at the degree course Post Basic B.Sc Nursing unless she/he passes in all the subjects prescribed for First year and Second year Examination.
	If students fails in two theory papers/ one theory- one practical/ two practical will be allowed ATKT (i.e. will be promoted to next year) but she/he has to appear for supplementary examinations held subsequently in the failed subjects and practical in the same year and unless she/he will not clear the subjects/ practical will not be allow to appear for annual examination.
4.12	If students fails in more than two theory papers and practical will not be promoted to next year and she will have to clear these examination to be eligible for the promotion to the next year.

- 2. A minimum of 80% attendance in theory and Practical/ clinical in each subjects is essentials for appearing in the examinations
- 3. 100% attendance in Practical/ clinical in each clinical areas is essentials before award of degree.
- 4. 50% of minimum marks in each theory and practical paper separately is required for passing.
- 5. A candidates has to secure minimum of 33% in qualifying for passing.

	A)STANDARD OF PASSING:			
	To pass the First Year Examination and Second Year Examination, a candidate must obtain at least 50% marks in each subjects at the institutional test and at the University Examination.			
	A candidate has to secure minimum of 33% in qualifying subject (i.e .English) for passing.			
	B) AWARD OF CLASSES:			
	Examination shall be graded on the aggregate marks of the Two years programme as follows;			
	Distinction :- 70% AND Above			
	• First Division : 60 % TO 69.9%			
	• Second Division: 50.1 %TO 59.9%			
	• Pass Class : 50 %			
	C) SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATIONS:			
	University may hold supplementary examination after six months of the annual examination.			
C:1	If student fails in Two theory or Two practicals or one theory and one practical examination, she may be promoted to next year of the study. She /he has to appear for a supplementary examination held subsequently in the failed Papers /Practical.			
C:2	After second failure in the same paper, the student may discontinue in the college at the discretion of the college authorities and appear for next examination subsequently.			
C:3	If a candidate fails in more than Two theory and or practical shall repeat the whole year.			
C:4	If a candidate fails in either theory or practical, she has to re-appear for both the papers(Theory and Practical).			
C:5	A candidate will be allowed to appear for One Annual examination and Two supplementary examination each year.			
	D) PRACTICAL EXAMINATION:			



D:1	Practical examination in first Year and Second Year should be preferably conducted by the same college in the respective clinical area.				
D:2	Practical examination will be conducted by Two Nurse Examiners (One Nurse Examiner will be from the parent college and other will be nominated by the university from other college).				
D:3	Not more than 20 students should be examined per day.				
	E) EXAMINATION:				
	University shall hold an Annual Examination and may hold a Supplementary Examination after Six month of the Annual examination for each year of study.				
E:1	FIRST YEAR EXAMINATION:				
a)	A student will be allowed to appear for the First Year Annual Examination as per eligibility conditions laid down by Indian Nursing Council. (Page No. 7 of the Post Basic B.Sc Nursing Syllabus)				
b)	If a student fails in Two theory or Two practicals or one theory and one practical examination, she may be promoted to next year for the study. She will have to appear for a supplementary examination held subsequently in the failed Papers /Practicals.				
c)	In the Supplementary examination, if she fails to clear failed subject paper/ practicals in the above supplementary examination she will NOT be allow to appear for the SY Examination.				
d)	After a second failure, a student may continue at the discretion of Institutional authorities and may appear in the next examination subsequently.

a)	A student will be allowed in SY examination as per eligibility laid down by Indian Nursing Council (Page No. 7 of the Post Basic B.Sc Nursing Syllabus)				
b)	If a student fails in Two theory or Two practicals or one theory and one practical examination of SY course, She will have to appear for a supplementary examination held subsequently in the failed Papers /Practicals.				
c)	If a student fails in more than two theory paper/ practicals She will have to repea S.Y course of study for one academic year and will be eligible for the S.Y. Annua examination in the theory papers/ practicals examination in which she has failed.				
d)	After second failure in the examination she may continue at the discretion of the Institution's authorities and can appear in the the next annual examination.
