Based on the students response received for the year, majority of the students have given satisfactory response for the relevance of additional source material.




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ACTION TAKEN REPORT BASED ON STUDENTS' FEEDBACK

Questionnaire No.1: Discussion of Findings with Action Taken: Overall Appraisal of Department

For 8 different parameters, with the help of four scales {Very Good (VG), Good (G), Satisfactory (S), Below threshold (BT)} objective type questionnaire data have been collected for Depth of the course content including project work if any, Extent of coverage of course, Applicability/relevance to real life situations, Learning value (in terms of knowledge, concepts, manual skills, analytical abilities), Clarity and relevance of textual reading material, Relevance of additional source material, Extent of effort required by students and Overall rating.

Pertaining to the Depth of the course content including project work, if any (Q1), 39.7% students found it good where as 44.8% found it very good. For extent of coverage of course (Q2), 22.1% students found it satisfactory where as 43.5% found it very good. Related to applicability/relevance to real life situations (Q3), 28.2% students found it satisfactory where as 44.8% found it to be very good. In the case of learning value (Q4), 17.3% students found it satisfactory whereas 45.6 % found it to very good. Clarity and relevance of textual reading material (Q5) was reported by 18.6% students as satisfactory while 43.7% found it to be very good. Pertaining to the relevance of additional source material (Library) (Q6) 27.6% students found it to be satisfactory where as 40.8% found it to be very good. Extent of effort required by students (Q7) indicated that 22.8% students found it satisfactory whereas 42.8%

found it to be very good. The overall rating (Q8) of the course depicted that 13.8 % found it to be satisfactory whereas 49.9 % found it to be very good. (Fig.1)




Fig:1 Overall Appraisal of Department for year 2016-17




Fig.2 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2016-17




Fig.3 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2016-17

- (3) More than 63.6% students felt that the course is manageable and about 14.5% student felt that the course was difficult.
- (4) There was mixed opinion by the students regarding syllabus covered in class. About 63.6% of the students said that 85% to 100% syllabus was covered in class
- (5) Most of the students found excellent library material for the course.
- **(6)** Approximately 58.2% students easily obtained the prescribed reading material. Remaining students found some difficulty for this.

Pertaining to the depth of the course content including project work, if any (Q1), 41.5 % students found it satisfactory where as 17.7% found it very good. For extent of coverage of course (Q2), 46.1% students found it satisfactory where as 20.8% found it very good. For applicability/relevance to real life situations (Q3), 48.6% students found it satisfactory where as 20.4% found it to be very good. In the case of learning value (Q4), 28.8% students found it satisfactory whereas 26.4 % found it to very good. Clarity and relevance of textual reading material (Q5) was reported by 33.8 % students as satisfactory while 24.1 % found it to be very good. Pertaining to the relevance of additional source material (Library) (Q6) 46.8% students found it to be satisfactory where as 25.2% found it to be very good. Extent of effort required by students (Q7) indicated that 50.3% students found it satisfactory whereas 23.5 %




Fig:1 Overall Appraisal of Department for year 2017-18




Fig.3 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2017-18




Fig.4 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2017-18




Fig.5 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2017-18




Fig:1 Overall Appraisal of Department for year 2018-19




Fig.3 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2018-19




Fig.4 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2018 at 9 ent of Home Science Sardar Patel University Vallabh Vidyanagar-388120




Fig.5 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2018-19

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found it to be very good. The overall rating (Q8) of the course depicted that 25.3 % was found it to be satisfactory whereas 28.8 % found it to be very good.




Fig:1 Overall Appraisal of Department for year 2019-20




Fig.2 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2019-20




Fig.3 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2019-20.




Fig.4 Overall Faculty Evaluation by Students for year 2019-20
