$44 \%$ students are very much satisfied with the course content. $48 \%$ students are of opinion that syllabus is worth. And $4 \%$ students are satisfied with the content. So the content of the M.A. (Sanskrit) is proper according to them. While $4 \%$ students believe that there is requirement to change the course content.

Extent of coverage of course


So far as the extent of coverage of course is concerned, $30 \%$ students are of opinion that course was covered as whole as per the need of subject title. $57 \%$ believe that the course has been satisfactorily framed. These students are satisfied with the course covered. While $13 \%$ have moderate opinion about the coverage of the course.
